



## PIXIES Planet Of Sound 4AD/Elektra

The Pixies return triumphantly with a new four-song single. Half rockin', half melodic noise, *Planet Of Sound* is sure to please long standing Pixies fans as well as newcomers to the band.

Starting off with the hardedged titletrack, Black Francis sings through tons of distortion over heavy guitar, bass and drum licks. The Planet Of Sound is a place everyone should visit several times in their life, It is noisy and energetic, full of a wide range of sound and musical cacaphony.

Theme From NARC is a spytheme for the nineties, performed Pixies style. It is reminescent of the 60's surf tunes (one of which was covered on their last album Bossanova) mixed with the cool feel of modern day James Bond. Again, rough guitars and throbbing bass over driving drum beats.

Build High is a countrified send-up, with harmonies added by Pixie queen Kim Deal. It bounces allover the stereo, like you're riding a bucking bronco with the band. The added twangy vocals over the two-step beats and guitars make this song a real novelty.

The final track, Evil Hearted You, is more straightforward, with Black Francis singing in his second tongue, Spanish. His voice is soft and controlled over the acoustic guitars. If you played Vamos at one third the speed you'd end up with something akin to Evil Hearted You.

The Pixies continue to move

forward in their musical legacy, improving on their former style and adding new brilliance to their recording career. Pick this one up in anticipation of the new album.








#### BOOKS & LITERATUR



I. G. BALLARD Research Publications

"The work of the novelist is to invent reality..." J. G. Ballard

It's probably not a great surprise if you've never heard of author J. G. Ballard here in the United States. The controversial Ballard has been blackballed by virtually every major publishing company in the States. Fortunately, ReSearch, in their continuing effort to enlighten and bring valuable authors and literature to light, has published this comprehensive study of Ballard and many of his important works.

Writing since the sixties, Ballard still remains a "cult" writer, far off the path of "mainstream" works that clutter the New York Times best seller list. Writing in the genre of Science Fiction, Ballard has taken a new approach to the integration of man and machinery, see-

ing the two as equal parts of society in this so called "modern" world. Man and machine are married, and the consumation of that relationship

is where Ballard's writing begins, exploring all the possibilites of this unusual union. Science Fiction becomes Science Fact.

The book begins with two in-

terviews; one with Ballard and another with Martin Bax, a close associate of Ballard and publisher of Ambit, an experimental magazine on which Ballard also works. These interviews give initial insight into the mind and method of Ballard; as much as is possible with any artist. Ballard seems, outwardly, the typical family man, having raised his children on his own after his wife died. Living at home and caring for his family gave him the time to write and cultivate his creative genius, having written some of the most startling and provocative literature of the

past thirty years. According to Ballard, "unless you've got a really powerful imagination (it doesn't matter what the form or medium is), you will have nothing." Ballard certainly has something and is at no loss for imaginative narrative and

This is witnessed in the second and third parts of the book which contain excerpts of Ballards fiction and non-fiction. Ballard's writing is complex, full of long sentences, and complicated medical and technical terms. This is not to say that the reader is bogged down by unnecessary jargon, but the language of technology and science are integral parts of Ballard's stories, emphasizing the technocratic society in which we live and de-emphasizing the humanistic elements that have been major factors in literature up to the twentieth century. Relationships are with cars, planes, or various other machines instead of humans. Intimacy exists between men and the products of a manmade world. The implications of

the Industrial Revolution are taken to their fullest extent. After all, aren't we all astronauts, having once visited Mars and Venus, or having "walked beside Armstrong on the moon?"

The rest of the book contains autobiographical sketches of Ballard, critical interpretations of his work, quotes and some collages that Ballard ran in major magazines. All these give greater depth to the body of work created by

This ReSearch book is an informative introduction to Ballard and can be used as a preface to The Atrocity Exhibition, also published by ReSearch, as well as a study of one of the most creative and unrecognized literary minds of this era.

#### THE HISTORICAL ILLUMINATUS CHRONICLES VOLUME THREE: NATURE'S GOD By Robert Anton Wilson

Italy, France, England, and the American Colonies are the background for this philosophically fictional account of the American Revolution, among other things. This is the latest installment in the Illuminatus saga of the conspiracies that shape the world and the people who control (or are controlled by) them. The roles of religion, politics, technology, economics, and overall human behavior are discussed and answers are tentatively provided in an attempt to analyze the empirical world. While intellectually stimulating, Wilson's bizarre and synchronistic tale conveys not only the theories but also the emotional impact of illumination.

Sigusmundo Celine has just arrived in the New World from Europe as an exile of Italy for a duel he fought there as a youth. He travels to the frontier to live alone, in nature, and explore the reaches of his mind. "A universe without a monarch or a parliament," he writes in his wilderness diary as he begins to reconcile his experience into a coherent picture of the world. A musician of strong passion and believer in free thought, Celine has witnessed firsthand the scope of the Illuminati's plans, the Freemasonic counter-conspiracy, and the complexity of the interconnectedness of life.

In England, Sir John Babcock, a brother of Sigusmundo's in the Craft (speculative freemasonry) and Whig (liberal) in the British

Parliament, not only challenge the conventions of politics, but also the dogmatism of the Royal Scientific Society. His Wife, Maria, writes a book, A Moistness in the Wind, similarly challenging the prevailing religious dogma, asking "...whether or not God had a penis, and, if not, what was the source of the attitude of reverence that the Christian clergy exhibited toward that organ...," referring not only to the masculine pronouns used to express "God," but also to why the leaders of the church had to, by definition, possess a male sexual

The reader especially gets to know Nature's God through Seamus Muaden, once an outlaw from Ireland, now colonel in Washington's patriot army. Seamus' exposure to Washington, Jefferson, and Paine and their fanaticism for freedom and liberty. along with his own history of British subjugation, sets him on a journey toward understanding of the world through direct experience and subjective inference of the Laws of Nature and mysticism.

In Wilson's profound and erudite manner of iconoclasm, he brazenly calls into question much of what are accepted or assumed facts about past and contemporary societies, presenting perspectives of cynicism, idealism, pragmatism, and spiritualism with irony, paradox, and at time utter confusion and nihility of the human condi-

As with his other books, Nature's God is a beautifully crafted synthesis of ideology and opinion; intellect and emotion; permanence and relativity. Though found in the science fiction section, Wilson's Illuminatus series is a highly enjoyable, thought provoking metaphor (or is it literal?) written with insight, humor and tenacity that is a compelling as it is important. Robert Anton Wilson is a voice of our times and culture, and has been for some time, having written more than twenty books, including Cosmic Triggor (Vol. 1 and 2), Sex and Drugs: A Journey Beyond Limits, Ishtar Rising, The Schrodinger's Cat Trilogy, and, along with Robert Shea, The

# FRACIAL METHOD GORM, GORMES AND DIMENSION

Fractal Method arrived on the Salt Lake scene in December, 1989. The brainchild of William Clarke Walker III, Fractal has progressed through myriad changes since its inception, but its original paradigm, energy level, and Clarke have remained constants.

Primarily a one man effort, this musical project shrieks of talent and forces recognition of many facets of reality that one might rather ignore. For example, the symbolism in songs like "Deadly Complication", the hard painful facts of "Technology", and Grover's apocalyptic lyrics in "Ground Zero" might well present us with aspects of ourselves and our reality that we'd rather not face. Perhaps we might all learn a little something as we groove with this master of sound.

The music of Fractal Method is tightly wound, bursting with energy, and strikes a subconscious chord throughout. I find myself swaying to and fro in perfect time to a sound that rings solid and true. Fractal Method is even more exciting on stage, in live performance, than on recordings. Given a fair opportunity in the industry, this conceptual wiz-

ard should be exposing his vision on a global scale sooner rather than later. Solidly founded in the conviction that within the boundaries of this plane one should do what one must, this music speaks for itself, and is exactly what it must be.

Live shows are an invitation to permanent brain damage, as roots of punk/ metal and elements of industrial/dance collide at the speed of life, leaving consciousness vour shredded in the bewildering array of effects and chaotic sounds. Be prepared for some scorching vocals, ultra-violent sequences, grinding guitars, and killer visuals. Due to the constantly changing

line-up of live musicians, one never knows what to expect from this over-whelming sonic assault. Despite any reservations one might harbor, Fractal is sure to get under your skin.

Remembering back to the first Fractal show at the infamous Speedway Cafe, I recall a shadowy, gloomy arena foretelling of a new band just come to the local scene. With anticipation, I awaited this new discovery. On came a shrouded being bearing sticks of incense and a dark, somber face. music began, and I was fascinated, for such raw integrity and passion is rarely found in subterranean music. And every

subsequent performance has been better than the last!

This appraisal of Fractal Method may extend to some national labels as well. Even as you read this, Fractal is being researched by a national record pool and considered by major label A & M. Check out the upcoming show at the Pompadour, September 13 or 14 where Fractal will be headlining a bill which includes Tom Purdue and Lily's Remains. Fractal Method will also be playing in this year's Sabbathon, Sunday August 25th. You'll be sure to get your money's worth of great tunes and danceable music.

Clarke's search for new musical permutations and constant production of recordings keep public appearances to a minimum, but be assured that Fractal Method will continue to play an important and unique part in the Salt Lake scene. So pay attention, folks, Fractal Method could be exploding in all directions (as fractals do), and if you blink, you might miss something. With two full-length cassettes available, and a third on the way, this autonomous neo-industrial pagan has set his sights, and the sky is not the limit.

#### BOYZ N THE HOOD

"Believe the Hype"

I like films that attract gunfire and this is a film that is doing exactly that. Though the theatrical body count now stands at one dead and about a dozen wounded, these figures could be rising, what with the daily opportunities that abound. Blood and box office. Meanwhile, I can't help but think of the irony if the triggers bothered to pay any attention to the movie itself, they might realize that the point of the whole thing is "Hey, brothers, let's not kill each other!"

"Increase the peace," says twenty-three year old John Singleton, who has written and directed this streetwise story of three black youth and the 'hood they call home. Starting in 1984 and jumping seven years to the now, we focus on the lives of Tre (Cuba Gooding Jr.), Randy (Morris Chestnut), and Doughboy (Ice Cube) as they survive and seek escape from the hometown hell. Singleton knows the turf well. One gets the impression that he has seen the blood and alcohol drenched streets, and heard the shots, screams, and sirens firsthand. With intelligence and understanding, he captures the tension, anger, humor, and love of the territory. He shuns no issue, touching along the way bias history lessons, mistreatment of women, lack of parental guidance, police brutality, college entrance exams, the military, drug abuse, sex, economics, and even the existence of God.

As for acting, despite looking a little old for high school students, the crew is emotionally convincing. A special nod goes to Ice Cube for his role with an attitude that slices but we understand why. Also Larry Fishburne is commendable as Furious Styles, a positive paren-tal role model that sends Cosby packing for Mr. Rogers' Land of Make-Believe.

So BOYZNTHEHOOD might be the film that lets us gain a little insight and understanding. And although it's been igniting quite a barrage of bullets, hopefully, in the end, it might be able to stop a few

Depending on whose stories you believe, we could be "blessed" with the presence of a stop on the Lallapalooza tour.

For you uninitiated, this tour (a day-long affair) boasts performances by big-names like Siouxsie and the Banshees, Jane's Addiction and Living Colour and stints by alternative cultural icons such as Butthole Surfers and the Rollins Band. Who's bringing this tour is a mystery, as are ticket prices at this point. Frankely, though some "modern music" gurus have been pushing like hell, I'm hoping it passes us by.

Why, you ask, especially when some of these bands have never hit Salt Lake and may never have the chance again? The truth is, there is no conceivable concert site to house this debacle, unless it's either Park West, Bonneville Raceway or the Salt Palace

#### TELEVISION...

In one of the biggest surprises in KBYU history, that station has begun airing the cult series THE PRISONER, Made in the late '60's, this seventeen episode series is one of the most thoughtful and intriguing creations television has offered.

The plot centers around a man(Patrick McGoohan) who resigns what is apparently a top-secret job in the British government, and packs for a vacation. However, before he can finish packing, a hearse pulls up outside of his apartment building and a gentleman sprays gaseous vapor through the keyhole. The man then wakes up in a community knowen only as the village. The Village affairs are evidently directed by a person known as Number 2 who informs the man that he has been brought to the Village to answer questions . the man is thereafter referred to as Number 6.

As the series progresses, Number 6 faces an ever changing parade of Number Two's, all trying a variety of methods to discover the answers to questions only Number 6 can answer.

This simplistic overview of the series cannot begin to describe the crux and focus of the show, however, weighty philisophical issues such as pacifism, brainwashing, the uselessness of political campaigns, media sloppiness, and especially freedom are all explored through this pattern of

Number 6 being tortured, teased and tricked in order to get him to divulge his secrets.

Just who is Number 6? What knowledge does he possess? Wher is the Village? Who runs the Village? These questions are all suggested, but never answered. But it matters little, for the idea behind the series is to get the viewer thinking.

The special effects are occasionally lowbudget and cheesy (like the weather balloon enforcer in the Village, Rover), but it doesn't matter. The setting and location are impeccable, using the Welsh resort of Port meirion to depict the bizzare Village.

Likewise the acting is terrific, especially by McGoohan and occasional Number 2 Leo McKern. But the real appeal of the series is the direction and writing, which create believable situations from unbelievable ideas, which in turn serves to jump-start the viewers mind.

Overall, THE PRISONER works to remind those of us jaded by television's mostly soporific offerings that T.V. can be entertaining and even thought-provoking, a notion worth remembering even after TWINPEAKS was cancelled. If this review sparks an interest, the reader is encouraged to watch KBYU on Tuesdays at 9:00 pm.

#### NOTES FROM THE INDUSTRIAL UNDER GROUND..

The past couple of months have seen some terrific reissues on Elektra/Mute records. After the fall of Enigma, Elektra picked an much of the Mute catalogue and has rereleased titles from "Industrial" Icons, Throbbing Gristle, Slavik Superstars, Laibach, German noisemasters Einstuerzende Neubauten and techno king Frank Tovey's Fad Gadget. The Throbbing Gristle titles are a wonderful history lesson in the roots of "Industrial" music and the poeple who went on to form Psychic T.V. and Chris & Cosey. Forget the dance beats and thumping disco rythms that plague so many Nitzer Ebb clones. Throbbing Gristle is a montage of noise and instrumentation overlayed with the ramblings of poet/prophet Genesis P'Orridge. Industrial Records pioneered the movement that is now full of so many dance bands who use machine noises to augment their beat oriented mumbo-jumbo. Unfortunately, I don't agree with P'Orridge's dismissal of the Al Jourgensen school of Death Disco and see them as positive mutators

of the genre that started in the midseventies. The Laibach title is Occupied European Tour, and "chromieles the band live. Laibach's mixture of noise and theatre has an appealing, visual element-even on CD. To fully experience the Neue Slovenische Kunstone must seethe actual performance, but until then, the live CD will have to do. From E.N comes a double CD of live and unreleased tracks, Strategies Against Architecture 2. A must forlovers of grungy noise and aural chaos. As for Fad Gadget, Tovey wrote many of the catchiest technopop songs of the early eighties and was ripped-off by any number of less-talented and untalented bands like Depeche Mode and those early eighties "innovators." Fad Gadget takes classic patterns and rythms and makes them technical monsters, full of synthezised noises. Add the catchy, sing along lyrics and you have a huge collection of Fireside Favourites. Look for more titles to be realeased soon in this same series... Coil's Love's Secret Domain has finally been released domestically on WAX TRAX! It's more dancy than anyone would have expected, especially from a band that makes Clive Barker's "bowels churn." Still, it's got all the Coil spookiness and erie sounds that you love the band for. I don't see huge crowds lining up to dance to this record, but it will certainly be a with favorite Coil everywhere...Next month, new releases from Consolidated, Kode IV, Cat Rapes Dog, Schnitt Acht and Zoviet France.







These incidents are not aberrations. They are part of a very scary trend: neo-Nazis resorting to radical acts to accomplish their goals.


